Additional Required Documents

Student must submit:

- 1. **A personal statement** outlining your reasons for wanting to study at Boston University School of Law, including the types of courses you are interested in taking (approximately 250 to 500 words).
- 2. Your CV or resume
- 3. **An International Student Data Form** (Please read the instructions on the form carefully and be sure to sign the last page.)
- 4. Financial Documentation: Immigration documents cannot be issued unless complete financial documentation is submitted, in English, showing sufficient funds to cover estimated living expenses and fees. Estimates of expenses and fees are available at https://www.bu.edu/law/admissions/llm-admissions/llm-admissions/foreign-exchange-students/. Samples of acceptable financial documents can be found at https://www.bu.edu/law/admissions/llm-admissions/visa-documentation/. We require original copies with original signatures.
- 5. **TOEFL Scores**: Arrange to have your TOEFL results sent directly from ETS to Boston University School of Law. Our code is **9627**. Visiting students are required to score at least 600 (paper-based), 250 (computer-based) or 100 (internet-based) on the TOEFL or to demonstrate their English proficiency through another test to the satisfaction of Boston University. If you have not taken the TOEFL, we will waive the requirement for visiting exchange students provided they complete a phone interview and demonstrate sufficient English proficiency.
- 6. A copy of the information pages of your passport.

Your university must submit:

- 1. **Letter of permission and recommendation** from the Dean or Dean's designate of your law school stating that you are a student in good standing and that credits earned at Boston University School of Law will be applied toward a degree at your law school. Any specific courses you are required to take here during your visit should also be included; we will try to comply, pending availability.
- 2. Official copy of your transcript for all courses already taken.

The application deadline is April 15, 2017 for the fall semester (2017) or full year and September 1, 2017 for the spring semester (2018). Please send all application materials to:
