

Boston University PA Program Goals Report (Standard A3.14b)

• Goal 1: Provide the didactic and clinical experiences that cultivate the development of competent entry level PAs.

Data that demonstrates the program is meeting Goal 1 is from A. Disease and Therapy Course Outcomes, B. PANCE Pass Rate, C. Graduate and Exit Surveys.

- **A. Disease and Therapy Course Outcomes:** The Boston University PA Program's unique didactic curriculum combines second year MD and didactic phase PA students in the same systems based course for the study of pathology, pathophysiology, pharmacology and microbiology called Disease and Therapy (DRx). This provides a strong foundation of medical knowledge. In general, the mean exam scores for the 30 PA students is usually 1-5 points below the mean exam scores for the 150 MD students with a standard deviation of 5-7 for each group.
- **B. PANCE Pass Rate:** The first time taker pass rate for the PA National Certifying Exam (PANCE) has been 100% since our first class graduated in 2016. The national first time taker pass rate has varied from 93-98%. PANCE Five Year First Time Taker Summary Report
- **C. Graduate and Exit Surveys:** The Boston University PA Program has recently changed from a graduate survey administered one year after graduation to an exit survey at the end of the program. The classes of 2016 2018 received the Graduate Survey and the class of 2019 received an Exit survey. Boston University PA Program uses a 5 point Likert Scale (0= not applicable, 1=strongly disagree, 2=disagree, 3=neutral, 4=agree, 5= strongly agree)
