Muslim Pakistani-Canadian journalist, author, public speaker, media consultant, anti-racism activist and interfaith discussion leader.

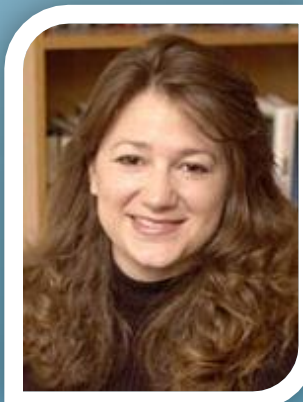

The organization is a non-profit organization and its stated objective is "interfaith interaction and discussion."

In 2006, the National Muslim Christian Liaison Committee honored her for promoting Muslim-Christian dialogue in the wake of the Pope Benedict controversy.
