*Students graduating with a major in Anthropology & Religion are able to articulate and act on a theoretical and practical understanding of:*

1. The general properties of a religious worldview and the appropriateness of regarding our species as fundamentally religious beings.
2. The varieties of religious belief, expression, experience, and practice.
3. Regional themes and diversity in religious traditions and behavior.
4. Fundamental religious themes in at least one society other than their own, and the relationship of those themes to the dynamics of social organization.
5. The ways in which religious belief and practice both canalize and reflect economic and political forces within and between communities.
6. The historical development of anthropological thought about religion, and the relationship of that thought to theorists outside of the discipline who have been influential in the study of religion.
7. The relationship of religion to social and ethnic identity in both simple and complex societies.
