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1. List the learning outcomes for the program

Students graduating with a major in French Studies are able, through the acquisition of knowledge and skills related to the French language, to:

- 1. Demonstrate a solid understanding of the French language, and apply and explain frequently encountered elements of its grammar, syntax, and vocabulary
- 2. Use French to complete many everyday, academic, and professional tasks, according to the standards described as "Advanced-Low" by ACTFL guidelines
- 3. Relate a foundational knowledge of the field of Linguistics to the morphology, syntax, and history of the French language

Through the acquisition of knowledge and skills related to literary analysis, to:

- 1. Analyze and appreciate language and literature, engage in close reading, and formulate interpretive arguments about literary works in discussion and in writing
- 2. Discuss major works of French and Francophone literature (and in some cases film) with attention to their historical, generic, or cultural context
- 3. Read and analyze previously unfamiliar works in French using these skills and knowledge

Through the acquisition of knowledge and skills related to history and culture, to:

- Show familiarity with all of the following:
- 1. Major events, periods, and people responsible for shaping the history of France from the Middle Ages to the present day
- 2. The legacy of France's colonial past, especially as related to the diversity of Francophone experience
- 3. The enduring and evolving roles of the French language and its literature and culture in a contemporary global context

Through the acquisition of intellectual, professional, and technical skills needed for career growth and development, to:

- 1. Apply the skills of close reading and rhetorical analysis in everyday contexts
- 2. Evaluate and analyze arguments about literature (film, etc.) that are intended for a non-specialist audience

- 3. Demonstrate writing and research skills appropriate to entry-level professional use and/or continuation toward graduate study, including the ability to formulate an organized, well-supported argument; to write clearly and persuasively; and to observe ethical and precise citation practices
- 4. Recognize and respond appropriately to many traditional cultural norms and expectations in France, as might be encountered during everyday interactions
- 5. Apply all of these skills and knowledge to communicate ideas effectively
