This is a 5-year program that combines the BFA in studio and MA in Art Education. Students study the academic components of the program during their Junior and Senior years and complete the MA degree with one full year of field experiences at the elementary and secondary levels.

Upon completion of this program students will be eligible for an initial teaching license in MA public schools providing they have achieved the following outcomes with a 3.0 average or above.

- Develop learning and teaching skills that demonstrate dialogic pedagogy and a thorough knowledge of studio practices.
- Design developmentally appropriate curriculum for all students
- Successfully complete a pre-practicum and internship experience
- Know and understand the principles of practice required for pre-k-12 initial licensure
- Develop interpersonal, leadership, and research skills to ensure successful transitions to both school learning environments and studio classrooms
- Demonstrate support for one another in both the development of studio teaching skills, and either curriculum or thesis design, development, research, and writing.
