PHILIP KASINITZ (BOSTON UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS, 1979) IS PRESIDENTIAL PROFESSOR OF SOCIOLOGY AT THE GRADUATE CENTER OF THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK. HE SERVED AS EXECUTIVE OFFICER (CHAIR) OF CUNY'S DOCTORAL PROGRAM IN Sociology from 2001-2011. He specializes in the study of urban SOCIOLOGY, INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION AND RACE AND ETHNICITY. **P**ROFESSOR KASINITZ IS THE AUTHOR OF CARIBBEAN NEW YORK: BLACK *IMMIGRANTS AND THE POLITICS OF RACE*, THE EDITOR OF *METROPOLIS*: CENTER AND SYMBOL OF OUR TIME, CO-EDITOR (WITH JOSH DEWIND AND CHARLES HIRSCHMAN) OF HANDBOOK ON INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION, CO-EDITOR (WITH MARY C. WATERS AND JOHN MOLLENKOPF) OF Becoming New Yorkers: Ethnographies of The New Second Gener-ATIONS, CO-AUTHOR (WITH WATERS, MOLLENKOPF AND JENNIFER HOLDAWAY) INHERITING THE CITY: THE CHILDREN OF IMMIGRANTS COME *OF AGE*, WHICH RECEIVED THE **2009** MIRRA KOMAROVSKY AWARD FROM THE EASTERN SOCIOLOGICAL SOCIETY AND 2010 DISTINGUISHED PUBLICATION AWARD FROM THE AMERICAN SOCIOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION AND IS MOSTLY RECENTLY CO-EDITOR (WITH MITCHELL DUNEIER AND ALEXANDRA MURPHY) OF THE HANDBOOK OF URBAN ETHNOGRAPHY. HE IS A FORMER PRESIDENT OF THE EASTERN SOCIOLOGICAL SOCIETY AND A THREE TIME WINNER OF THE THOMAS AND ZNANIECKI AWARD FOR THE BEST BOOK IN THE SOCIOLOGY OF INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION. IN ADDITION

TO NUMEROUS PUBLICATIONS IN ACADEMIC JOURNALS, HIS WORK HAS APPEARED IN THE NATION, DISSENT, THE WALL STREET JOURNAL AND LINGUA FRANCA. AND HE EDITS THE BOOK REVIEW SECTION OF THE JOURNAL SOCIOLOGICAL FORUM. HE IS A MEMBER FORMER MEMBER OF THE SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH COUNCIL'S COMMITTEE ON INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION AND THE RUSSELL SAGE FOUNDATION'S COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE SOCIAL EFFECTS OF 9-11 ON NEW YORK CITY AND IS CURRENTLY A MEMBER OF THE STATUE OF LIBERTY -- ELLIS ISLAND FOUNDATION'S HISTORICAL ADVISORY BOARD. KASINTZ RECEIVED HIS PHD FROM NEW YORK UNIVERSITY IN 1987. PRIOR TO COMING TO CUNY HE TAUGHT AT WILLIAMS COLLEGE AND HE HAS HELD VISITING POSITIONS AT PRINCETON AND THE UNIVERSITY OF AMSTERDAM.
