

Title: Lecturer

The Department of Social Work in the College of Health and Human Services seeks a full-time lecturer to begin August 15, 2014. This is a 9-month position that covers the academic year (August-May). Primary responsibilities include: planning, teaching and managing four courses per semester for two semesters; student advising; and participation in University, College and Departmental governance activities and committees. The Department's greatest teaching needs are in the area of direct social work practice and human behavior. Candidates with knowledge, skill, and experience in both areas are strongly encouraged to apply.

Minimum Qualifications: (a) an MSW degree from a CSWE-accredited program; (b) a minimum of three years post-MSW full-time practice experience; and (c) candidates without a doctorate are required to be licensed as a LCSW in North Carolina or a state that has reciprocity with North Carolina.

Preferred Qualifications: (a) prior teaching experience at the collegiate level; (b) prior teaching experience at the BSW or MSW level; and (c) 5 years post MSW full-time practice experience.

- (e) Three letters of professional reference.
