Each track in the MDiv program and specialization in the MTS program has its own plan of study, which outlines the distributional electives necessary to fulfill that specific track's curriculum. TRACKS WITHIN THE MASTER OF DIVINITY PROGRAM (MDiv)

Boston University School of Theology's Master of Divinity (MDiv) program is unique when compared to the programs at most other seminaries. Rather than assuming that all incoming students' vocational goals are the same, the School of Theology recognizes that God calls people to a variety of pastoral, teaching, artistic, and social justice vocations, and that all of these callings can benefit from the practical theological training offered through an MDiv program. For this reason the faculty developed four distinct tracks in the MDiv program. The goal of these tracks is to help students shape their curricula toward their future vocational plans. Added flexibility within many of the tracks allows students to take courses beyond the School of Theology through the Boston Theological Institute and throughout the other Schools and Colleges that comprise Boston University. Up to 1/3 of a student's MDiv coursework (32 credits) can be taken beyond the School of Theology, a fact that makes this degree especially attractive for those pursuing interdisciplinary interests.

All entering students declare their chosen track during the application process, and can change their tracks until mid-way through their MDiv curricula if their vocational plans develop in a different direction. Students pursuing ordination may enroll in any of the four tracks, but are responsible for knowing how the curriculum of that track fits with their denomination's requirements for ordination. United Methodist students pursuing ordination as an elder for the vocational purpose of local church ministry may find the Pastoral Ministry Track their best fit, as it is designed to cover all the requirements for elder's orders in the UMC and most other mainline denominations.

MDiv Pastoral Ministry Track

The Pastoral Ministry Track is appropriate for students pursuing ordination as a denominational elder, deacon, or pastor. It is also appropriate for those entering chaplaincy, campus ministry, or pastoral care in any vocational setting. Beyond the core courses required (such as biblical studies, theology, and history) this track's curriculum emphasizes seven competencies of church-related ministry: Worship, Preaching, Ethics, Religious Education, Mission and Evangelism, Pastoral Care, and Spirituality. While the goal is for each graduate to engage each of these competencies during the program, students can shape their curricula toward whichever of these competencies best fulfills their vocational goals.

MDiv Church and the Arts Track

The Church and the Arts Track is designed for students pursuing sacred music, music ministry, liturgical studies, homiletical arts, literature and religion, sacramental theology, aesthetics or the dual degree program with the Master of Sacred Music. Some students in this track will find coursework at Boston University's College of Fine Arts helpful toward shaping their curricula, while others may be engaged with individual University departments, such as the Department of Comparative Literature, Department of History of Art & Architecture, or the Department of Romance Studies. Opportunities abound for musicians seeking rehearsal and performance opportunities, as well, with Symphonic Chorus, Marsh Chapel Choir, Inner Strength Gospel Choir, The Seminary Singers, and several other choral ensembles offering a wide repertoire range.

MDiv Global and Community Engagement Track

The Global & Community Engagement Track is appropriate for students pursuing vocations in conflict transformation, missiology, history of global mission, ecumenism, interfaith dialogue, trauma healing & theology, social-justice work, non-profit management (NGO), and military chaplaincy with an emphasis on conflict transformation. This is the most flexible of all the tracks in terms of curricular requirements. For this reason, students in the track work closely with their advisors to shape their coursework in the way that best prepares them for their vocational goals. This is a particularly good track choice for entering MDivs still seeking clarity of call, as it affords the opportunity to explore interdisciplinary coursework without endangering progress in the program.

MDiv Religion and the Academy Track

The Religion and the Academy Track is appropriate for students in any academic discipline who are seeking to pursue doctoral studies to teach in the academy. This track relies heavily on advisor mentoring to help each student know what courses are best to prepare for doctoral work in a chosen field. When appropriate, language studies are part of the coursework for this track. Examples of contextual education within this track include shadowing a professor, working in a lab setting, or working through the publication process.
