Time Management Tips

- Use a calendar to keep track of everything in your schedule, including assignment due dates, classes, meetings, and activities. You may even want to block out time for studying and sleeping so that you have ample time for them.
- Try to complete homework and studying early in the day so that at night you have time to relax, watch TV, hang out with friends, etc. Having something fun to look forward to can help counter procrastination.
- Use small chunks of time wisely. While you're on the T, read or study instead of playing games on your phone. Go to the library in between classes if you have any short breaks. You'll get more things out of the way earlier in the day.
- Plan ahead in your schedule. If you know that you have a large research assignment due at the end of the semester, plan out how much time you think you'll need to complete it. Write this down in your calendar so that the assignment doesn't take you by surprise the week before it's due.
