Tips for Choosing Classes

In addition, many students change their majors; by taking an unrelated course, you may realize that your interests are broader than you think.

Sometimes classes fill up before you are able to register for them. To prevent stress, have a backup plan—decide on "plan B" courses in case your first choices are not open. Remember that sometimes spots open up later, so check Student Link frequently.

When choosing class times, consider when your periods of peak productivity occur. If you are not much of a morning person, try to schedule your most difficult classes for the afternoon or evening.

Finals Survival Guide

Write down the date and time of each final and each essay due dates on a calendar. Then plan out blocks of time for studying and writing each day. This will help prevent procrastination and the need to cram the night before.

It can be difficult to figure out what and how to study when the information is scattered between your notes, textbook, assignments, and old quizzes. Make a study guide compiling all of the information you will need for the exam. You'll have a concise collection of information that will be easier to study from.

While studying, take breaks to refresh your mind. Take a walk, a short nap, or do anything that you find fun. This will give your brain a rest, and you'll be able to focus better.

The night before the exam, it's important to get a good night's rest. Cramming the entire night and getting little to no sleep isn't a good idea. Your brain needs sleep in order to be alert and recall information most efficiently.

Right before the exam, review the most important information that you need to know. That way it will be fresh when you go in to take the exam.

Find the Perfect Summer Internship

- BU's Center for Career Development has a wealth of resources to help you find an internship. They offer counseling appointments, resume/cover letter assistance, and lots of helpful information on their <u>website</u>.
- Who you know can be as important as what you know. Students often find internships through one of their contacts. Begin by asking your family and friends if they know of any opportunities.
- Visit <u>CareerLink</u> and a few of the many internship database <u>websites</u>. You can tailor your search to find internships that would work well for you.
- Once you have a list of internships in which you are interested, send the
 organizations your resume and cover letter, in addition to anything else they ask
 for. Follow up a week later with a phone call; this will help you stand out.
- Know the organization inside and out and research the position itself before going into an interview. Your effort will show how interested you are in the opportunity.




