## **Boston University Astronomy Department's Statement on Sexual Harassment**

The Boston University Department of Astronomy is strongly committed to fostering a safe, comfortable environment for all of our members. We want all students, instructors, researchers, and other associates to be able to focus on their roles as productive learners, teachers, and scientists. Sexual harassment in our community interferes with these goals and will not be tolerated.

If you are a victim of, or a witness to, sexual harassment, you are encouraged to report it; please know that your report will be handled in an extremely serious manner. There are a number of people with whom you can discuss your concerns and allegations (see below). Some of these will hold your conversation in strict confidence. Others are obligated to report the alleged infraction of Boston University's Sexual Harassment Policy to a higher-level administrator. Faculty and staff (including graduate students acting as teaching fellows) are obligated to report incidents of alleged sexual misconduct involving a member of the BU community to the BU Title IX Coordinator. Members of the Arts & Sciences community that experience or witness sexual misconduct can discuss this with a faculty member, the Astronomy Department chair, or a Title IX coordinator, keeping in mind that all of these people are obligated to report allegations of misconduct to a higher-level administrator.
