University housing or BU "rooming style" rental property**	In person or remotely	Twice a week	Daily
Off-campus	Attending classes in person and on campus more than once a week	Once every 7 days	Daily
Off-campus	Attending classes in person and on campus no more than once a week	On your first visit to campus and once every 7 days, if coming to campus	Daily
Off-campus	Remotely	Not required	Not required
Address not on record	LfA status not on record	Once every 7 days	Daily

* Regardless of how often you are on campus, if your on-campus employment or service obligations require interaction with other students and community members, you must be tested the first time you are on campus and then once every 7 days, if coming to campus.

** BU graduate housing in "rooming style" rental properties are considered on-campus housing for testing frequency. This includes off-campus properties at 90 St. Mary's Street, 183 Bay State Road, 850 Beacon Street, and 210 Riverway (Peabody Hall).

METROPOLITAN COLLEGE AND OTHER STUDENT CATEGORIES

Category	Testing Frequency
Metropolitan College Students	Depending on your presence on campus, you will be prompted to be tested once or twice a week, with daily symptom check.
Employees taking BU courses	Testing frequency is directly related to your presence on campus. So if you are a Category 4 staff member (which requires no testing), but are taking a class that requires you to be on campus even during the semester, your status will temporarily shift to Student Category 2 or 3, depending on how often you come to campus, and you will need to test accordingly. Please alert your manager of any classes you plan to take.
BU Academy students taking BU courses	Testing twice a week; Daily symptom check
BU Academy students not taking BU courses	Testing once every 7 days; Daily symptom check
