

# Research Study on Language Recovery After Stroke

## Have you experienced difficulties with word finding or language after a stroke?

Researchers at the Boston University Center for Brain Recovery are conducting a study to test a new **home-based language therapy** combined with **non-invasive brain stimulation**.

## Who can participate?


- Adults with post-stroke aphasia
- At least 6 months post-stroke
- Able to participate in home-based activities with or without caregiver support

## What does the study involve?

- A virtual screening and language evaluation
- An in-person visit to learn how to use the therapy tablet and brain stimulation device
- Daily home-based language therapy and brain stimulation sessions (Monday–Friday for 3 weeks)
- Two virtual follow-up assessments, one week and one month after the intervention
- Sessions are supervised remotely by a research team member via videoconference
- Participants will be compensated up to \$125
