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DESCRIPTION OF FEES

Application Fee: This amount is required to process applications. The application fee and tuition deposit are non-refundable and non-transferable.

University Fees: This amount consists of a \$40 Community Services/Program Fee and \$60 Student Services Fee charged to all students.

Medical Insurance: All students are required to have medical insurance. In the fall semester, this amount provides medical insurance coverage for the fall, spring, and summer semesters. For the spring semester, this amount provides medical insurance for the spring and summer semesters.

Room/M meal Plan: Students may choose to live in Boston University dormitory housing. This amount is based on costs for a shared room (two or more students) in a dormitory-style residence. Depending on the availability of particular residences, some students may be assigned to other accommodations which may cost more. All students living in Boston University housing are required to have a meal plan. Several plans are offered; this amount is based on 14 meals each week plus Dining Points for additional food purchases. Other dining plans are available. Students are not required to live on-campus. This is an estimated expense that is used for immigration (I-20) purposes.

Personal Expenses: This estimated amount includes costs for books, supplies, and other miscellaneous expenses. Your actual expenses may differ. This is an estimated expense that is used for immigration (I-20) purposes.

Total Estimated Expenses for I-20 Purposes: Students applying to a full-time program must provide financial documents that match or exceed the total estimated expenses of the program they are applying for to receive an I-20 Certificate of Eligibility.
