Students must earn a **minimum** of 48 course credits with grades no lower than B- in graduate-level coursework per the <u>Bulletin</u> (see <u>Bulletin archives</u> for pre-Fall 2023 curriculum). - If MT 401 theory review and/or MH 401 history review (2 credits ea.) is required per the proficiency entrance exam, these courses do not count towards the degree and must be passed with at least a B- before a student can take graduate coursework in these areas
- Use of elective credit: Students can choose from grad courses (500 level and above) with SoM prefixes MU, ME,
 MP, MH, MT. MET graduate classes in Arts Administration will satisfy elective credits
- Students must register for 7 credits minimum to a maximum of 11.5 credits per semester for full-time status
- Refer to the Bulletin for terminal projects and qualifying exams
- Reading proficiency is required in one language, chosen from German, French, and Italian. Students may
 demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language by passing its corresponding reading course at the Graduate School
 of Arts & Sciences: <u>GRS LG 621</u>, <u>GRS LF 621</u>, or <u>GRS LI 621</u>. Students may also satisfy the requirement by passing a
 foreign language examination, administered once each semester by the School of Music
- After a student has finished coursework and is completing their dissertation and/or qualifying exams, they must register for continuing studies MU 996 each semester through graduation
- All students MUST <u>apply to graduate</u> before their final semester of study, complete all degree program requirements, and earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 to be awarded a degree per <u>CFA</u> <u>Graduation Policy</u>.
