Students must earn a **minimum** of 48 course credits with grades no lower than B- in graduate-level coursework per the <u>Bulletin</u> (see <u>Bulletin archives</u> for pre-Fall 2023 curriculum). Refer to the <u>Graduate Student Handbook</u> for the full complement of policies and procedures.

- If a student is required, per the results of the proficiency entrance exams in theory and musicology, to take MT 401 and/or MH 401 review courses (2 credits each), they must take the course(s) their first semester and pass them with at least a B- before advancing to graduate work in these areas. These review courses do not count for graduate academic credit
- Approved music electives can include SOM grad courses (500 level and above) with SoM prefixes MU, ME, MP, MH, MT. MET College graduate classes in Arts Administration will also satisfy elective credits
- Students must register for 7 credits minimum to a maximum of 11.5 credits per semester for full-time status
- Students are expected to register for classes on <u>published dates</u> and must register for classes each semester through graduation unless taking an approved <u>leave of absence</u>
- Refer to the <u>Bulletin</u> for the recital requirements and qualifying exams
- Reading proficiency is required in one language, chosen from German, French, and Italian. Students
  may demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language by passing its corresponding reading course at the
  Graduate School of Arts & Sciences: <u>GRS LG 621</u>, <u>GRS LF 621</u>, or <u>GRS LI 621</u>. Students may also satisfy
  the requirement by passing a foreign language examination, administered once each semester by the
  School of Music
- After a student has finished coursework and is completing their qualifying exams, dissertation and/or recital, they must register for continuing studies MU 996 each semester through graduation
- All students MUST <u>apply to graduate</u> before their final semester of study, complete all degree program requirements, and earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 to be awarded a degree per <u>CFA Graduation Policy</u>.
