Students must earn a **minimum** of 32 course credits with grades no lower than B- in graduate-level coursework per the <u>Bulletin</u> (see <u>Bulletin archives</u> for pre-Fall 2023 curriculum). Refer to the <u>Graduate Student Handbook</u> for the full complement of policies and procedures, including the following general notes:

- If MT 401 (2 credits) theory review is required per the proficiency entrance exam, it does not count towards the degree and must be passed with at least a B- before a student can take graduate theory (MT 601 or 602)
- Use of elective credit: Students can choose from grad courses (500 level and above) with SoM prefixes MU,
  ME, MP, MH, MT. MET graduate classes in Arts Administration will satisfy elective credits
- Students must register for 7 credits minimum to a maximum of 11.5 credits per semester for full-time status
- All students MUST <u>apply to graduate</u> before their final semester of study, complete all degree program requirements, and earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 to be awarded a degree per <u>CFA</u> Graduation Policy.
