Students must earn a **minimum** of 48 course units with grades no lower than B- in graduate-level coursework per the <u>Bulletin</u> (see <u>Bulletin archives</u> for pre-Fall 2025 curriculum) and are expected to <u>declare either Dissertation or Recital Track</u> by the beginning of the second year of study. Refer to the <u>Graduate Student Handbook</u> for policies and procedures.

- 18 units of applied lessons, taken over 6 semesters of study. Students must register for hour-long lessons (CFA ML 5xx odd-numbered courses) unless studying with two instructors (in which case register for 2 @ half-hour even numbered courses)
- 4 semesters of MP 600 Orchestra and/or MP 602 Wind Ensemble. Note: students must register for ensembles as assigned in their seating audition, in each of their first four semesters of study
- String Departmental Requirement for 4 units/4 distinct semesters of Chamber Music MP 608
 - DMA Harp Majors are required to take MP 649 (Harp Ped/Lit) all 6 semesters, and this may substitute for any or all of the Chamber Music required units
 - o DMA Bass Majors may substitute MP 640 (Orch Tech) for any or all of the chamber music
- If a student is required, per the results of the <u>proficiency entrance exams</u> in theory and musicology, to take MT 401 and/or MH 401 review courses (2 units each), they must take the course(s) their first semester and pass them with at least a B- before advancing to graduate work in these areas. These review courses do not count for graduate academic units
- 3 units in music theory courses, MT 600-level or above (for example, MT 601 or 602)
- 6 units in musicology courses, MH 600-level or above
- CFA MT 701 Doctoral Proseminar: Skills (3 units) Typically taken in Fall of second year
- CFA MT 702 Doctoral Proseminar: Analysis (3 units) Typically taken in Spring of second year
- CFA MP 705 Writing for DMA Recital Track (1 units) Typically taken in Fall of third year
- 14 units of electives:
 - o Students can choose from grad courses (500 level and above) with SoM prefixes MU, ME, MP, MH, MT
 - o MP 600 orchestra, MP 602 wind ensemble, and MP 608 chamber music will count towards elective units, as will additional graduate courses in MT and MH taken beyond the required units
 - o MET graduate classes in Arts Administration will satisfy elective units
 - Applied lessons may be taken for up to 4 units per semester instead of 3. Any additional lesson units(s) beyond the required 18 would satisfy elective units, but no more than 5 units of extra applied lessons may be applied towards electives. Students must submit a <u>course substitution form</u> to request use of additional lesson units for elective units
- Students must register for 7 units minimum to a maximum of 11.5 units per semester for full-time status
- Students are expected to register for classes on <u>published dates</u> and must register for classes each semester through graduation unless taking an approved leave of absence
- Refer to the <u>Bulletin</u> for recital requirements and <u>qualifying exams</u>
- Reading proficiency is required in one language, chosen from German, French, and Italian. Students may
 demonstrate proficiency in a foreign language by passing its corresponding reading course at the Graduate School
 of Arts & Sciences: <u>CAS LG 621</u>, <u>CAS LF 621</u>, or <u>CAS LI 621</u>. Students may also satisfy the requirement by passing a
 foreign language examination, administered once each semester by the School of Music
- After a student has finished coursework and is completing their qualifying exams and/or recitals, they must register
 for continuing studies MU 999 each semester through graduation, regardless if they are also taking applied lessons
- All students MUST <u>apply to graduate</u> before their final semester of study, complete all degree program
 requirements, and earn a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 to be awarded a degree per <u>CFA</u>
 Graduation Policy.
