## Esther B. and Albert S. Kahn Career Entry Fund for the Arts Boston University College of Fine Arts

## **Purpose**

The Esther B. and Albert S. Kahn Career Entry Fund for the Arts was established to provide funds to assist talented students at the beginning of their careers who have completed undergraduate or graduate programs at Boston University College of Fine Arts.

### **Eligibility for the Grants**

Boston University College of Fine Arts undergraduate or graduate students in the performing and/or visual arts completing their last semester of study prior to graduation (and not continuing in other programs of study) are eligible to compete for the Kahn Career Entry Fund award.

## **Number and Size of Grants and Other Conditions**

The number and size of grants awarded each year are determined by the available income from an endowment fund managed by Boston University. It was the intention of the donor, Mrs. Esther Kahn, to award one-year grants. This year's awards will total \$45,000. Six final candidates (one graduate student and one undergraduate student per school) will be chosen and will each receive \$5,000. The final award winner will be chosen from the final candidate pool and will receive an additional \$15,000 for a total of \$20,000. Please note: these awards may be subject to taxation.

The awards are based on a combination of talent, artistic accomplishments, and strength of application and presentation.

### **Selection Process**

Each School will select two final candidates (one graduate student and one undergraduate student per school) for the consideration of the Selection Committee.

Each finalist is required to deliver a brief (10-12 minute) in-person presentation in which they provide an overview of the written application and share examples of their work in the visual and/or performing arts. The strength of the presentation will play a role in the overall evaluation process.

The selection of the final award recipient will be made on **April 14**, **2026**.

## **Application Requirements**

Please submit the following documentation *in this order* to your School Director by Friday, February 27, 2026:

- ◆ A one- to two-page proposal, outlining your career entry plans and how the Esther B. and Albert S. Kahn Career Entry Fund for the Arts will assist your transition from student to arts professional;
- ◆ Your curriculum vitae;
- ♦ A one-page personal statement discussing your role as an artist in contemporary society, including an illustration of your concern for social issues, as well as how the award funds will be of particular benefit to you at this time;
- ◆ A one-page general budget outlining anticipated expenses as you begin your career;
- ◆ A completed and signed application form;
- ◆ Your work portfolio, submitted according to the requirements described on the attached "requirements for supplemental materials" sheet;
- ◆ A nomination letter from a faculty member.

#### Applicants should submit:

## School of Visual Arts only:

A portfolio of up to fifteen images, submitted as a PDF.

## **School of Theatre** *only***:**

A portfolio of no more than 15 pages, submitted as a PDF.

## School of Music only:

A list of links to performances hosted on a website, in Dropbox, or in Google Drive, submitted as a PDF. Please clearly indicate one file of no more than five minutes, and ensure that viewing permissions are granted on the host platform.
