This is a graduate & advanced undergraduate-level course intended for a wider audience from a range of disciplines, including urban and environmental planning and management.

Class will meet on Mondays 6-9pm: March 13, March 20, April 3, April 24, May 1.

Fridays 9am-6pm: March 31, April 14, April 21.

Course Description

The course is designed to be "immersive": it includes field trips, guest lectures, discussions, and simulated "games" that mimic multistakeholder processes.

- Draws on the practices and theories of living systems theory, sustainability and climate change to understand what "sustainability" can mean in different contexts.
- Concludes with a seminal project developed during a week-long field experience, in which students will identify, analyze, and develop practical proposals to real world issues.
