All courses listed below have a COM prefix unless otherwise noted. All courses require a minimum pre-requisite of sophomore standing unless otherwise noted.

Students who take all three of JO 404, JO 412 and JO 490 must note that only eight units total from these three courses can count as Journalism Program Requirements. Students can only take a maximum of 12 units from these three course numbers toward units for graduation.

Note: Any COM JO course 300-level or above may count as a Journalism Program Requirement. We encourage students to work closely with their assigned faculty mentor, a Journalism professor, as you select your Journalism Program Requirements based on your educational and career goals.

Degree Requirement Notes:

- A minimum of 128 units is required for graduation
- Students must also complete all BU Hub general education requirements
- A maximum of 4 units of 1 unit or .5 unit Boston University courses can count toward graduation.
- Journalism students are limited to a total of four JO internship units through the departmental internship coordinator and another four units of JO internship through a BU Study Abroad Program. No more than eight units of JO internship can count toward the degree. In instances where students complete eight JO internship units as described here, four of those units can count toward the Journalism Program Requirements and the other four units of JO internship will count as general electives toward the total unit number required for graduation.
- Only eight units of each of the following courses can count toward the 128 required units for a degree: JO 400, JO 412 (Internship), JO 490.
- We do our best to keep course pre-requisites noted on this guide current, but the most up to date pre-requisite listings are on MyBU Student.
