THE SIX HUB CAPACITIES, AND HOW CORE CLASSES SATISFY THEM:

1. PHILOSOPHICAL, AESTHETIC, AND HISTORICAL INTERPRETATION
 - a. **(PLM)** Philosophical Interpretation & Life's Meanings (1 unit) - CC 202 or CC222
 - b. **(AEX)** Aesthetic Exploration (1 unit) - CC 101
 - c. **(HCO)** Historical Consciousness (1 unit) - CC 221

2. SCIENTIFIC & SOCIAL INQUIRY
 - a. **(SI1)** Scientific Inquiry I (1 unit) - CC 111
 - b. **(SI2)** Scientific Inquiry II (1 unit) - CC 212
 - c. **(SO2)** Social Inquiry II (1 unit) - CC 221 and CC222 (SO2 also satisfies SO1)

3. QUANTITATIVE REASONING
 - a. **(QR1)** Quantitative Reasoning I (1 unit) - CC 111
 - b. **(QR2)** Quantitative Reasoning II (1 unit) - CC 212

4. DIVERSITY, CIVIC ENGAGEMENT, AND GLOBAL CITIZENSHIP
 - a. **(IIC)** Individual in the Community (1 unit) - CC 181/182 (Core docent co-curricular) w/ CC 101 & CC 102, or CC 192 (Core Journal co-curricular)
 - b. **(GCI)** Global Citizenship & Intercultural Literacy (1 unit) - CC 101
 - c. **(ETR)** Ethical Reasoning (1 unit) - CC 202

5. COMMUNICATION
 - a. **(FYW)** Freshman Writing, e.g. WR 120 (1 unit) - CC 102
 - b. **(WRI)** Research Writing, e.g. WR 150 (1 unit) - CC 201
 - c. **(WIN)** Writing Intensive (2 units) - CC 221 and CC 202
 - d. **(OSC)** Oral and/or Signed Communication (1 unit) - CC 102
 - e. **(DME)** Digital/Multimedia Expression (1 unit) - CC 220 or CC 320

6. INTELLECTUAL TOOLKIT
 - a. **(CRT)** Critical thinking (2 units) - CC 212 or CC 222
 - b. **(RIL)** Research & Information Literacy (2 units) - CC 201
 - c. **(TWC)** Teamwork/Collaboration (2 units) - CC 111 or CC 320
 - d. **(CRI)** Creativity/Innovation (2 units) - CC 101 or CC 320
 - e. **(LSK)** Life Skills (no units required) - selected with advisors
