

K Award Mentoring Workshops

The Providence/Boston Center for AIDS Research (CFAR) is offering a six-month proposal development curriculum for post-doctoral fellows and junior faculty planning to submit a K award application on HIV/AIDS to NIH for funding.

This six-month proposal development curriculum is characterized by milestone driven progress and formal review by an advisory board of 3-5 advisors. Trainees will apply to the program with an identified primary mentor. Below is the schedule of meetings based on the NIH grant submission cycles.

Trainees enroll with mentor	Mar 7th
Specific aims page first review	May 7th
Full proposal for mock review	Jul 22nd
CYCLE III	Jan 7th
Trainees enroll with mentor	Aug 31st
Specific aims page first review	Sep 10th
Full proposal for mock review	Nov 19th
