



WAYS TO GIVE



There are many ways to support GSDM beyond making a gift today. If a current gift isn't possible, consider joining those who have included BU in their estate plans, which can include naming GSDM as a beneficiary of retirement funds, life insurance policies, or real estate. For questions or to explore planned giving options, please contact our Advancement staff.

Gifts of Stocks or Appreciated Assets

One of the most advantageous ways to give is through stocks or other appreciated assets. When you donate appreciated securities directly to our institution, you can avoid capital gains taxes that would typically apply if you sold the asset first. Additionally, you can deduct the fair market value of the gift on your tax return, up to certain limits. This method of giving maximizes your contribution without affecting your cash flow.

Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

If you are 70½ years old or older, you can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to GSDM. This option allows you to transfer up to \$108,000 per year without having to report the distribution as taxable income. This strategy can help you satisfy your required minimum distributions (RMDs) while supporting our vital programs.

Grants from Donor Advised Funds (DAFs)

Donor Advised Funds are an excellent way to manage your charitable giving. If you have a DAF, you can recommend grants to GSDM at any time. The beauty of this option lies in its flexibility; you can contribute to your DAF when it is most advantageous for you and recommend grants at your discretion. Additionally, contributions to a DAF are tax-deductible in the year you make the contribution.
