Melodies of Learning: Enhancing Chinese Language Acquisition by Music at BU

Current Learning


Limited Resources

Existing resources for first-year Chinese students lack simple Chinese language songs.

Engagement Challenge

Available songs are designed for children and may not engage collegeaged students.





Intended Outcomes

1 Improved Retention

Help students retain vocabulary, grammar structures, and pronunciation over time.

2 Greater student engagement and participation

Create a more dynamic and interactive learning environment, which could lead to increased student participation and engagement in the classroom.

3 Enhanced Cultural Appreciation

Incorporating songs into language learning can motivate students' interest in contemporary trends, fostering a deeper connection to Chinese society. This approach seamlessly blends language acquisition with cultural exploration, setting the stage for a sustained passion for China's dynamic pop culture and lifelong learning.

Project Implementation Steps

Song Development

Create short songs covering relevant topics for first-year Chinese curriculum. We compose the melody, arrange the music, record the instruments and vocals. Then finally we need to mix and mastering.

Music Video Production

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Record and produce music videos with visuals and subtitles.

Curriculum Integration

Integrate songs and videos into the first-year Chinese curriculum.
