## FINAL TRANSCRIPTS & DEGREE CERTIFICATES

All incoming students are required to submit to the GRS Admissions Office a final transcript, degree certificate or other official document showing all previous degrees conferred in a sealed envelope from your institution. If you have not submitted transcripts or degree certificates showing all previous degrees, please do so before classes start in September. If your degree will be conferred in September 2026, please submit an official document stating that you have completed all degree requirements by the start of the Fall 2026 Semester and an official transcript or degree certificate as soon as the degree is conferred. ## **REPORT OF MEDICAL HISTORY**

All entering Boston University students have pre-matriculation health requirements that must be completed prior to your first term at Boston University.
