GRADING

ATTENDANCE: Attendance will be taken and will count as 10% of the semester grade. If you have 2 or fewer absences, you will get full credit for attendance.

EXAMS: There will be a takehome exam from October 2 to October 7, a takehome exam from November 6 to November 11 and a final exam, also takehome. The final exam will be optional for those students who have a better than 80% in the course at the end of the semester. While the final exam schedule is not ready yet, those students taking the final can fax it in, and do not have to be on campus to take the exam. The exam average will count as 60% of the semester grade.

HOMEWORK: There will be at least 10 homework assignments. The lowest homework grade will be dropped, the homework average will count as 20% of the semester grade. PROJECT: There will be a project, to be done by teams of 5-7 students, to modify the annual report of a company which manufactures a product. The project grade, except in rare cases, will be same for every member of a team and will count as 10% of the semester grade.

FINAL GRADES: Those students, who have an average of 90% or better, have earned an A in the course and are exempt from taking the final. Students with an average of 80% (a B) or better are also exempt from taking the final exam, but may, at their option, choose to take the final exam to improve their course average.
