■ SUPERFUND RESEARCH PROGRAM

BU researchers investigate the impact of harmful chemicals on Cape Cod and in New Bedford and Fairhaven. Our findings can help improve the health of all District 9 residents, particularly vulnerable populations such as children and pregnant women.
