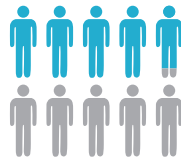

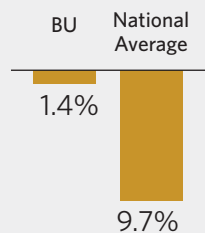

of BU's undergraduates complete their degree on time.



Only 1.4% of BU borrowers default on their federal loans after three years, compared to the national average of 9.7%.

is the typical (median) debt a BU student with loans graduates with.

DEMOGRAPHICS (2019/2020 DATA).

- BU has 16,936 undergraduates from all 50 states and 124 countries.
- **Gender:** 58.9% female/41.1% male
- **Race/Ethnicity:** Asian American: 17.1% African American: 4.1% Hispanic/Latino: 11.7% White: 36.4% International: 21.8% All other: 8.8%
- **State of Origin:** 28% in-state 72% out-of-state

Published cost of attendance (tuition, room and board, and fees) is \$72,052 for 2019/2020. But with student aid from BU and government sources, the average BU student pays \$24,506 per year.
