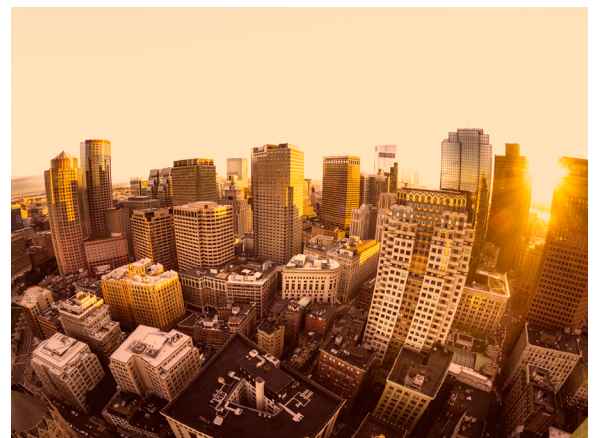

Beating the heat inequity in Boston

Record-high heat waves don't hit all parts of Boston equally. Some neighborhoods, like Dorchester, Mattapan, and Roxbury, get hotter than others during the summer because they have too much asphalt and not enough green space, and residents have limited capacity to get cool during extreme heat events. Boston University researchers, led by Associate Professor Patricia Fabian, are working with the City of Boston and local nonprofits to help policymakers declare heat emergencies with more geographic precision and better allocate needed resources. Their yearlong study will use local heat data to protect the city's hottest areas and ensure no neighborhood is left alone to swelter.
