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I. STUDY DESIGN

22 registered voters were presented bios of the top 5 Democratic candidates and top Republican candidates in the 2020 U.S. Presidential Election based on polling data and performance in the Iowa caucus and New Hampshire primary (see below). After reading each bio, respondents were asked to evaluate the candidate based on several key attributes (e.g., trustworthiness, expertise, assertiveness, attractiveness), feelings induced by the candidate, and likelihood to vote for the candidate. Data collection took place in the Communication Research Center between February 12-21, 2020.



**Joe Biden**  
Party: Democratic  
Age: 76

Joe Biden was a Senate Representative of Delaware for 36 years and the 47th Vice President of United States. He is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

As the Vice President, Biden worked to raise the living standards of middle-class Americans, reduce gun violence, address violence against women, and end cancer. Biden has also supported deficit spending for fiscal stimulus in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the increased infrastructure spending proposed by the Obama administration, mass transit, same-sex marriage, and the reduced military spending proposed in the Obama Administration's fiscal year 2014 budget. He favors efforts to invest and rebuild the middle class to bolster its competitiveness in the global economy.

Biden has been married to his wife, Jill Jacobs, for 42 years, and they have one child together. Biden also has three children from a previous marriage, two of whom passed away. Biden has five grandchildren.



**Pete Buttigieg**  
Party: Democratic  
Age: 38

Pete Buttigieg is former Mayor of South Bend, Indiana. Previously, he worked as a consultant at management consulting firm, McKinsey & Company, and served as a naval intelligence officer in the United States Navy Reserve. He is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

As a Navy Lieutenant and mayor, Buttigieg focused on bringing Americans from different backgrounds together in common purpose. He worked to transform South Bend by increasing household income and decreasing poverty and unemployment. He also launched municipal identification cards for undocumented immigrants. Buttigieg supports abortion rights, elimination of the death penalty, abolition of the Lectoral College, the strengthening of union bargaining power, higher minimum wage, national paid family leave, expansion of mental health care services, and initiatives to make college more affordable. He became the first openly gay person to seek the Democratic nomination, and has built his campaign around the idea of generational change.

Buttigieg has been married to his husband, Chasten Glotman, for two years. They have two rescue dogs, Rudy and Tristan.



**Amy Klobuchar**  
Party: Democratic  
Age: 59

Amy Klobuchar is a lawyer and U.S. Senator from Minnesota. A member of the Minnesota Democratic-Farmer-Labor Party, she previously served as the Hennepin County Attorney. She is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

As a U.S. Senator, Klobuchar favors reducing everyday costs for families, protecting consumers, strengthening the country's infrastructure, and ensuring fairness and transparency in democracy. She is pro-choice on abortion, supports LGBT rights and the Affordable Care Act, and was critical of the Iraq War. Klobuchar worked to pass the Bipartisan 2018 Farm Bill, authored an amendment aimed at boosting funds for STEM education for American students, and led national initiatives to boost American tourism. She also secured \$380 million to strengthen states' election infrastructure. Before being elected to public office, Klobuchar was the leading advocate for the successful passage of one of the first laws in the country guaranteeing 48-hour hospital stays for new mothers.

Klobuchar has been married to her husband, John Reader, for 26 years. They have one child together.



**Bernie Sanders**  
Party: Democratic  
Age: 78

Bernie Sanders is a U.S. senator from Vermont. In 2006, he was elected to the U.S. Senate after 16 years as Vermont's sole congressman in the House of Representatives. Bernie is now serving his third term in the U.S. Senate after winning re-election in 2018. He is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

A self-described democratic socialist and progressive, Sanders has been a proponent of workplace democracy. Sanders is known for his opposition to economic inequality. On domestic policy, he supports labor rights, universal and single-payer healthcare, paid parental leave, tuition-free college, higher minimum wage, and an ambitious Green New Deal to create jobs addressing global warming. In the area of foreign policy, he favors reducing military spending, pursuing more diplomacy and international cooperation, and putting greater emphasis on labor rights and environmental concerns when negotiating international trade agreements.

Sanders has been married to his wife, Jane O'Meara, for 31 years. He has four children and seven grandchildren.



**Donald Trump**  
Party: Republican  
Age: 73

Donald Trump is the 45th and current President of the United States. Previously, he was a real estate mogul, owned the Miss Universe and Miss USA beauty pageants from 1986 to 2015, and produced and hosted The Apprentice reality show from 2003 to 2015. He is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

"Make America Great Again" is his campaign slogan, under which his political positions have been described as populist, protectionist, and nationalist. He supports bilateral trade deals, deportation of illegal immigrants residing in the U.S., the repeal of Obamacare, and capital punishment. He favors an "America First" foreign policy, an increased U.S. military defense spending, and the idea that America should re-orient its resources toward domestic needs. He is opposed to gun control in general and rejects the scientific consensus on climate change.

Trump has been married to his wife, Melania Trump, for 12 years, and they have one child together. Trump also has four children from a previous marriage, as well as ten grandchildren.



**Elizabeth Warren**  
Party: Democratic  
Age: 70

Elizabeth Warren has been Senior Senator from Massachusetts since 2013. She was formerly a law school professor for over 30 years specializing in bankruptcy law. She is one of the U.S. 2020 presidential candidates.

A self-described progressive, Warren has focused on consumer protection, economic opportunity, and the social safety net in the Senate. Warren has released policy proposals including plans to assist family farms, reduce student loan debt and offer free tuition at public colleges, make large corporations pay higher taxes and increase regulation on large technology companies, and address opioid addiction. Warren supports worker representation on corporations' board of directors, breaking up monopolies, stiffening sentences for white-collar crime, universal and single-payer healthcare, and a higher minimum wage.

Warren has been married to her husband, Bruce Mann, for 39 years. They have two children, a golden retriever, and three grandchildren.

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## Amy Klobuchar

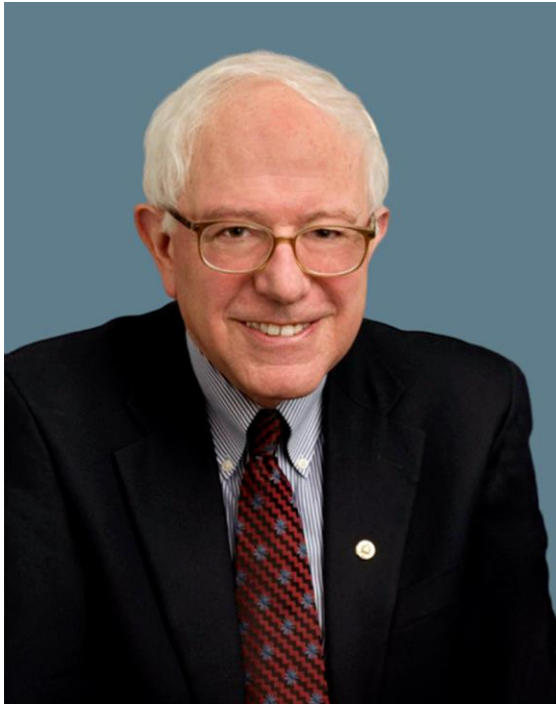
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Klobuchar has been married to her husband, John Bessler, for 26 years. They have one child together.

### III. MEASURES

This study measured physiological reactions during exposure to each candidate's bio captured by the iMotions biometric research platform which include facial expressions, eye tracking, and galvanic skin response. Following each candidate's bio, self-reported measures were collected through Qualtrics: demographics (gender, education, race, age, income, party identification, political orientation, voting registration status), candidate evaluations, and voting intention. 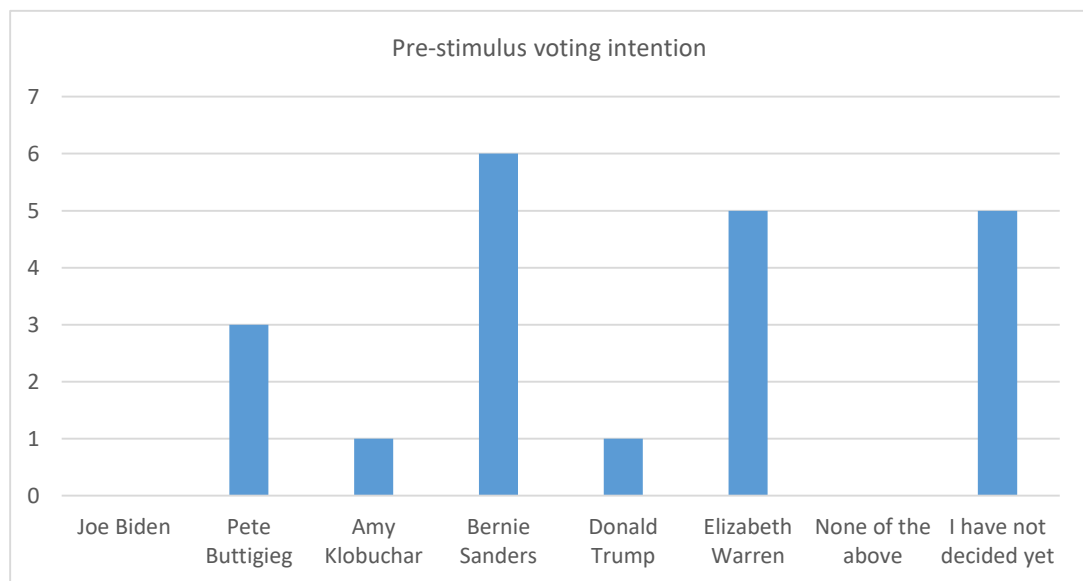

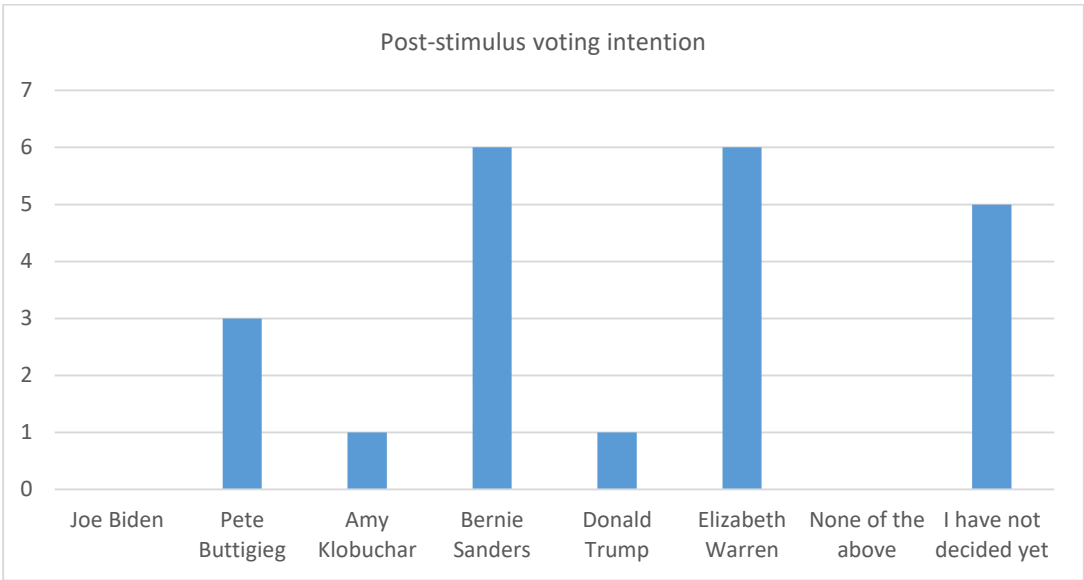

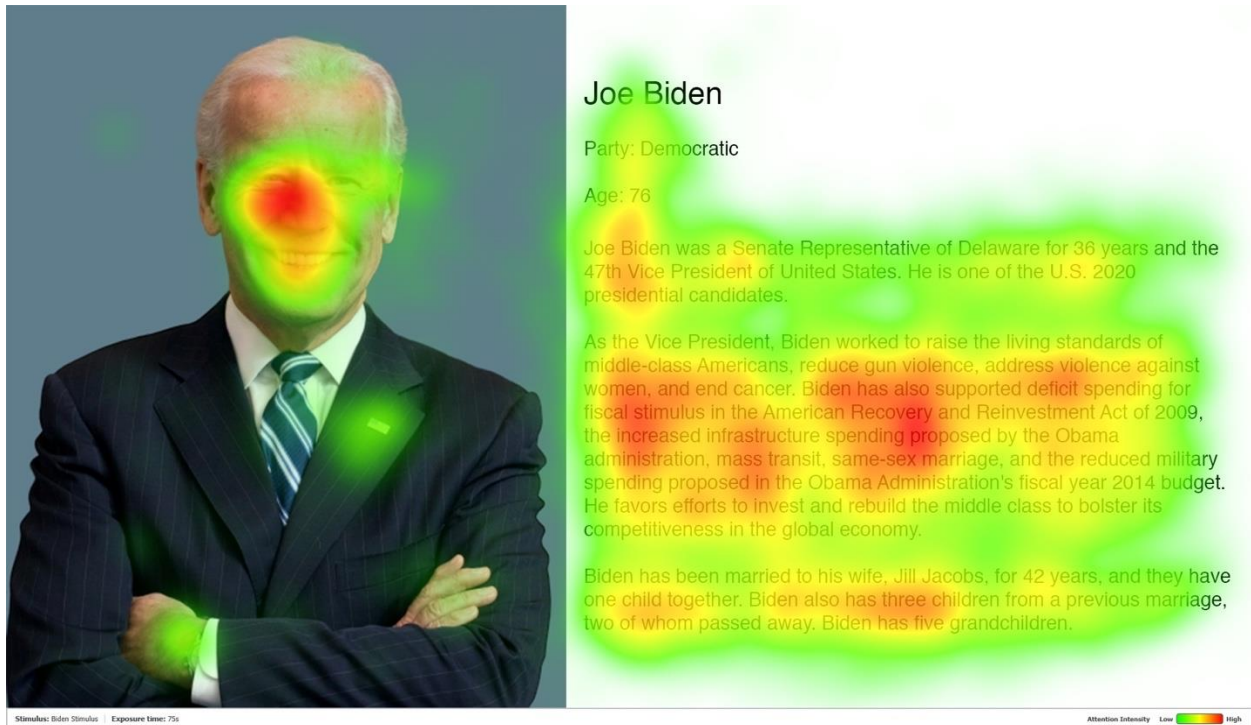

## B. Biometric Findings

### Eye Tracking

Eye Tracking refers to the process of capturing data about the eyes' position and movement as it relates to a 2D or 3D environment. Eye tracking is used to document human behavior in a natural, unobtrusive way and to gather objective data about real human responses to various environments/stimuli. Eye tracking uses optical tracking of corneal reflections (Pupil Center Corneal Reflection [PCCR]) to assess visual attention.



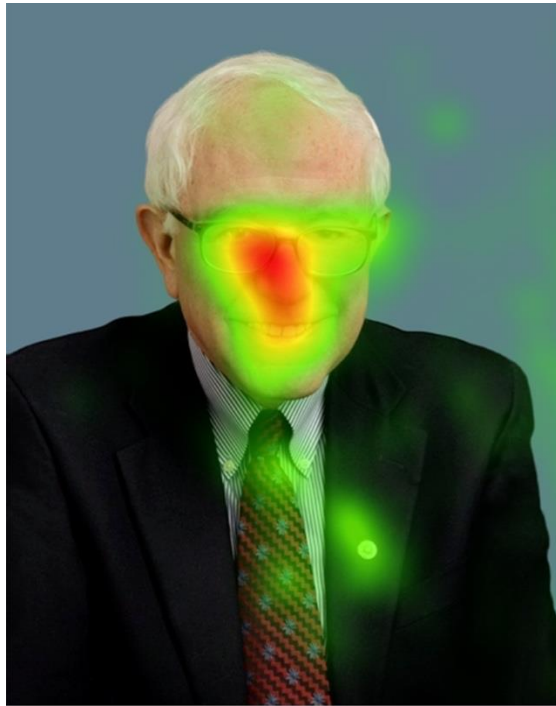



- Undecided voters spent slightly more time on the candidates' text than decided voters did (except for Buttigieg and Klobuchar).
- Respondents who make more than \$40,000 per year spent slightly more time on the candidate's faces and bodies than those who make less than \$40,000 per year did.

**Facial Expression Analysis**

Facial Expression Analysis refers to the process of continuously recording respondent emotions as indicated via facial expressions (i.e., movements of the muscles of the face). It is used to document immediate emotional reactions, both conscious and subconscious, in real time. Facial Expression Analysis uses (1) a common web camera to record the respondent, and (2) software that analyzes this footage, picks up landmarks or geometric locations on the face, and then calculates the discrete emotions manifested.

## Galvanic Skin Response

Galvanic Skin Response (GSR) is a method of measurement of the level of perspiration on the surface of the skin that is controlled by the autonomic nervous system. It is used to measure emotional intensity that is beyond the recognition or control of the subject (subconscious). GSR uses (1) physiological sensors (electrodes attached to specific parts of the body, in this case, the index and middle fingers) that pick up the electrical conductance of the skin, and (2) software that calculates the changing tonic and phasic levels
