- A silks solo by Anna Schechinger, and a lyra hoop duet by Anna Schechinger and Caitlin Miller.
- Two solos from the Aerial Apparatus Choreography class taught by Lynda Rieman.
- A lively medley of pieces was created by Dance Faculty instructor, Jossie Coleman, for her Hip Hop and Cardio Jazz
- Three solos by CFA dance minors from directed studies in choreography with Micki Taylor-Pinney.
