



APDA FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

- Centers for Advanced Research
- **Dr. George C. Cotzias Memorial Fellowship** 3-year, careerdevelopment award to assist promising young neurologists in establishing careers in research and clinical care (100K/year)
- Post-Doctoral Fellowships 2-year award to post-doctoral scientists (50 K/year)
- **Research Grants** 1 year award to PD research investigators, typically at Assistant Professor level (75K/year)
- **Diversity in Parkinson's Disease Research Grant** 1 year award to support research scientists studying the health disparities and/or differences among under-studied PD communities (75K/year)
- Social Sciences in Parkinson's Disease Research Grant 1 year award to support research scientists studying social issues related to PD (75K/year)
