Geddes now offering Faculty Mini-Grants for Course Redesign and other Technology Projects

The Geddes Language Center is pleased to announce a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the 2015-2016 Faculty Mini-Grant Program for amounts ranging from \$750 to \$1,500. Stipends are designed to provide initial funding to faculty members who are willing to explore and report on new ways to integrate technology and language learning, foster an environment in which faculty initiate innovative technology and learning projects and compensate for the extra time and effort to develop technology-based resources for their courses. All proposals will be reviewed on individual merit. 5 to 6 awards are made annually and are **due October 15, 2015.** More details on how to apply will be forthcoming.

Wikispaces will be administered locally and will be available to faculty in Romance


