Responsibilities:

This position will coordinate the development of work plans, budgets, and scopes of work for trips, short-term technical assistance, subcontracts, and country programs. Organize team planning meetings. Maintain paper and electronic files of project. Draft documentation of assigned project activities and results through project summaries and other types of written reports such as quarterly reports and annual reports.

Specific activities that this position will contribute to:

- Participate in the sustainability analysis of health programs including providing administrative and logistical support to the HIV/AIDS Program Sustainability Analysis Tool (HAPSAT) activities.
- Support Global Fund-related activities, including the development of evaluation guidelines for Health Systems Strengthening (HSS) Programs.
- Assist with other activities as needed.

- Knowledge of evaluation of health programs, particularly of HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis and/or diabetes.
- Experience in research methods, including in advanced statistics.
