

Evaluating Organizational Capacity in Ethiopia

Background

The Center for Global Health & Development (CGHD) is conducting a longitudinal study on the capacity of 44 NGOs serving highly vulnerable children in Ethiopia. The study examines the linkages between changes in NGO capacity, organizational performance and child health outcomes. Two rounds of data collection were completed in 2012 and 2013 and the research team is currently analyzing the data and preparing for Round 3.

The third round of data collection and data analysis will take place between June and August.

The research team seeks a team of students to participate in data collection, data analysis, and to contribute to a new methodology to assess and evaluate NGOs.

Scope of Work

January-June: Those interested, and with time availability, can participate in various study projects. Minimum commitment of 1-2 hours per week.

June to August: Training in the use of instruments and travel to the field for six-eight weeks (mid-June through August), for data collection. You will work with other BU researchers, local NGOs and international organizations involved in the study.

August: Return to Boston to assist in data analysis.

Costs

Interns must cover the full costs of travel, medical evacuation insurance, visa and living allowance. Estimated cost: \$3,000. Successful applicants can apply for a Santander scholarship.

Practicum

This internship may be used to fulfill the MPH Practicum requirement.

Preferred Qualifications

- Experience collecting/analyzing data, or have completed applicable coursework
- Strong writing and communication skills
- Ability to adapt to changing circumstances
- Willingness to learn in a fast paced environment
