## Keynote

This year's opening keynote will be Dr. Jon Cohen, Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer for Quest Diagnostics. Dr. Cohen will introduce the conference's key theme of patient-centered care and frame the major opportunities around patient consumerism for more effectively engaging the "end users" of medicine and define a new era of healthcare for the year 2020. Our closing keynote will be **Dr. David Meeker**, CEO of Genzyme, A Sanofi Group. Dr. Meeker will conclude this year's conference by summarizing key takeaways from the preceding panels and also speaking to innovations led by Genzyme, a leading pharmaceutical company implementing patient-centric strategies across its entire drug discovery value chain.

## "TERRIER Talks": Leading Examples of Innovation in Practice

Three TED-style speakers will present on specific applications of innovation across a range of organizations developing new technologies and collaborative models to individualize patient treatment. Dr. Leigh Zawel, the head of the Center Therapeutic Innovation (CTI) at Pfizer will present a new model of academic-industry collaboration in order to increase early scientific discovery. Dr. Brian Jack, lead investigator of Project RED will present on a new model for re-engineering discharge to reduce hospital readmission rates. Dr. Kamal Jethwani, Corporate Manager of Research and Innovation at the Center for Connected Health will speak about clinical information architectures and care management.
