

Pharmaceuticals Certificate

Nearly every public health program relies on pharmaceuticals to achieve its goals—from treating infectious diseases to managing preventive and chronic care. This certificate is one of the world's few programs examining the intersection of public health and the pharmaceutical sector. Students will gain skills in pharmaceutical development, delivery, and policy. Students will be able to effectively translate their knowledge and skills into rapidly growing public health, pharmaceutical, and medical technology markets.

Program Requirements & Eligibility

This program is open to MPH students in any of the School's eight concentrations and offers the opportunity to explore pharmaceutical-related issues within public health alongside SPH's standard MPH curriculum. The program requires a minimum of 12 credits and a B average in program-specific courses, a pharmaceuticals-related practicum, and attendance at pharmaceutical seminars throughout the program's duration. Pharmaceuticals certificate students are required to complete all MPH degree and Pharmaceuticals Program requirements.

Application

Students may apply to the Pharmaceuticals Program upon matriculation to SPH's MPH program by submitting a completed application and one-page statement of interest to the program director. Deadlines are October 1 and February 1 for the fall and spring semesters respectively.
