Dental Care

- Next steps for GPLC: open meeting with Dr. Kleinman as well as a follow-up meeting
- Issues with graduate students going to the dental school:
 - It's far for those not on the medical campus Appointments run really long (sometimes people have to go back for a second or third appointment for the same issue)
- 930 program
 - The waiting time is only around 10 mins
 - For employees, you don't have to pay for routine work (but they have insurance)
- *need more info about the possible old dental insurance plan*
- There are two dental options for the faculty/staff
 - ~\$18/month: restricted to BU providers
 - Pay more: like a PPO
- The information on the website is lacking
- Ultimately, everyone agrees that it would be best for graduate students to be able to get into the insurance plan that the faculty/staff currently has
 - Priority:
 - 1. Buy into the staff/faculty plan
 - 2.930 program
- GPLC survey from spring:
 - The results may have been thrown off by the fact that those under 26 may still be on their parents' insurance

PhD Funding Model

- The new summer internships are slightly more than was previously offered, but they are still not enough
- One major problem is with international students- they can't work based on the terms of their student visas, so it's very difficult for them to find the necessary funds for over the summer period

January Credit Reallocation

- No comments other than everyone agrees that it should be allocated separately so that it doesn't interfere with the credit limit for part-time students in spring semester

Met with GWISE, together they had a meeting with Dr. Kleinman GWISE had a thorough website with the information, this was integrated into the provost office's website (<u>http://www.bu.edu/provost/graduate-</u> <u>affairs/graduate-student-parenting-resources/</u>)

Networking among graduate students w/ dependents:

- Possibly creating a Facebook group (who would be the admin?)
- Planning to have a once-a-year open meeting
 Financial support:
 - Some other universities offer grants to students and/or offer discounts to child care at the university
 - BU didn't feel that there was money to put into that (as far as a direct grant)
 - BU is coming up with a small travel grant for those that attend conferences

Follow up: need some sort of outside funding

- UPenn: resources donated by different organizations (ex: Hasbro Toys), also offer up to \$3K/year grants
- Do we have a program at the School of Education (early childhood education)?
- It is possible for students to get on a waitlist for the preschool, but the waitlist takes years to get onto

Commuting Committee (Marianna Keaveney, msayeg@bu.edu)

- commuting discounts are offered to staff (eg. 50% off monthly MBTA commuter rail passes) but not to grad students (same for parking), creates a burden on grad students who live at a distance
