Financial aid

Please see the *Graduate Student Handbook* for a list of fellowships and assistantships in support of graduate study in History of Art & Architecture at Boston University. To indicate interest in being considered for financial aid, check the appropriate box on the application. There is no separate application for financial aid. Only applicants for fall admission will be considered for aid. International applicants are eligible for consideration for financial aid.

Type of Financial Aid	Eligibility	Benefits and responsibilities
Five-year Dean's Fellowships	PhD candidacy	Full-time course load. Tuition and fees covered plus stipend (including summer stipend). No duties for first, fourth, and fifth years; second year: lead discussion sections and grade in an undergraduate course; third year: either same as second year or assist in faculty research.
Tuition scholarships	MA candidacy	Tuition Scholarships may be accompanied by a stipend for work in BU's Stone Art Gallery or as a faculty research assistant. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis. Annual tuition and fee for four courses during the academic year 2020-21: \$28,552.

Course load

The typical course load for doctoral candidates is three to four courses (twelve to sixteen credits) per semester. The typical course load for MA candidates is two courses (eight credits) per semester. Students registering for fewer than three courses may submit a request for full-time certification. Writing sample

Submission of a writing sample is required. A college research paper or thesis is acceptable for post-BA applicants; for post-MA applicants, the MA thesis or a substantial scholarly paper can be submitted. If you are unable to upload your writing sample to the application, please send it as an email attachment to grs@bu.edu after you have submitted the application. Please include in the email your name, your Boston University ID number, and the Department to which you have submitted the application.

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All applicants upload a CV to the application.

GRE

The GRE is not required for applications submitted during the 2020-2021 academic year.

Letters of recommendation

Three letters of recommendation are required.

Museum Studies Certificate

The Museum Studies Certificate program does not have a separate application. The Department of History of Art & Architecture offers the option of pursuing the Certificate solely to its graduate degree candidates.

Interview

Though not required, an interview is recommended. Applicants have the option to meet the Director of Graduate Admissions and other faculty members. If you are planning to visit Boston University, please contact Professor Jonathan Ribner, Director of Graduate Admissions jribner@bu.edu. It is recommended that applicants to the PhD program make prior contact with the faculty member specializing in the proposed field of interest.

Deferral of Admission

If you are offered admission but wish to start at a later date, you may ask that your admission be reconsidered for a future semester. However, there is no guarantee that you will be admitted at a later date.
