### Dear Friends,

This was a year unlike anything we could have imagined. We are living through the most challenging time for Jewish college students.

Since Oct. 7, many of our students have been scared, confused, ostracized, and pushed to question their values and Jewish identity. In response to all of this, many students have deepened their passion and need for Jewish friendships, involvement, and community. While our team has worked around the clock to support Jewish students and respond to antisemitism on campus, our most important goal has remained infusing Jewish students with a love for Judaism, the Jewish peoplehood, and Israel.

Our mission is to help 6,000 Jewish students lead meaningful and joyous Jewish lives. We are educators, pastors, and advocates for all those who want to engage in Jewish community. This year, we had thousands of one-on-one conversations with students, attendances in Jewish learning classes, and participation in Jewish groups and projects. Even with concerns about the safety of travel, we had dozens of students come on Jewish immersive trips with us locally and to Israel.

This was a year of records. Yes, record amounts of antisemitism and attacks against Israel; however, it was also a record year of Jewish engagement at BU in the number of students studying, eating, and hanging out with friends inside of the Hillel building; the number of Jewish undergraduate and graduate students reached; and the number of university partners seeking our guidance on how to best support and take care of Jewish students. Our attendance logged a best-ever 33,000+ at Jewish life programs and events.

We are on the frontlines of fighting hate against Jews and building Jewish pride and the Jewish future. Despite what lies in the months ahead, we are inspired by God's words to Joshua who is given the seemingly impossible task of leading the Israelites after the death of Moses: "Be strong and resolute; do not be terrified or dismayed, for the eternal your God is with you wherever you go." When we stick together and when we care about each other, we fulfill the words of the prophets, and we join in the call coming from our beloved Israel today. "Together, we will prevail."

So many of you have been there for us this year, with your words of support and encouragement, your record numbers of contributions, and your presence. More than ever, we need you and we appreciate you. We can't thank you enough for everything you do.

# 2) Fighting hate and antisemitism

- 35+ BU students (half Jewish, half not Jewish) enrolled in BU Hillel's Fighting Hate and Antisemitism course
- 25+ BU Deans and Directors take Fighting Hate and Antisemitism class w/ BU Hillel
- Surveyed Jewish student population with 80 responses on climate of antisemitism on campus
- Tracked dozens of incidences of antisemitism to report to BU and other stakeholders
- Israel Uncovered group goes on 10-day trip to Israel, visiting Gaza border and many key sites (half Jewish, half not Jewish)











# Total Attendance = 33,110

# Lay Leadership

### **Board of Directors**

The BU Hillel Board of Directors provides oversight of the 501(c)(3) organization and focuses on mission, strategy, finance, and fundraising. The Board meets four times per year with a minimum gift required of \$5,000. The Board is comprised of alumni, parents, and community members, as well as BU faculty, administrators, and current students. Board members also serve on one of four different committees.

### **Director's Council**

The Director's Council is an advisory committee comprised of alumni, parents, and community members who engage with the CEO and Executive Director on the most pressing issues on campus. The Director's Council meets three times per year with a minimum gift of \$1,000.

### **Parent Council**

The BU Hillel Parent Council advises Hillel staff on student and family concerns as issues arise throughout the academic year. The group meets three times per year. Members are parents of current BU undergraduate or graduate students and contribute a minimum annual gift of \$1,000.

### **Alumni Council**

The Alumni Council serves as the primary networking and connecting body for BU Jewish alumni. Council members cultivate personal relationships with alumni through regional and campus events and connect with current students for mentorship and networking opportunities. The minimum gift is a sliding scale based on years since graduation, with a minimum gift of \$360 expected 10+ years post-graduation.

### **Faculty Council**

The BU Hillel Faculty Council advises Hillel staff on concerns related to BU faculty and administration. The Faculty on the Council serve as ambassadors for BU Hillel and discuss a broad range of issues across the University with senior administration three times a year.
