
### MAKE SPACE FOR PEOPLE


- <u>Create space for people</u>. Widen sidewalks, create new dedicated bike lanes and bus lanes, increase transit frequency, devote more space to open air markets, continue select street closures – especially in neighborhoods at greatest risk.
- <u>Survey residents and health officials to understand both risk & anxiety which residents feel vulnerable and where?</u> E.g. Commuting, shopping
- Recognize employers for formalizing work from home policies, staggering work hours, investing in bike parking, EV charging; Model these policies at City Hall.
- Make home a healthy space anticipate summer heat waves and cold snaps. Invest in energy assistance, home energy audits

### **CLEAR THE AIR**

- <u>Invest in green infrastructure</u> Put trees where they aren't and protect what you have.
- Keep decarbonizing buildings, transit, municipal fleets
- Make <u>active transit and e-mobility</u> options more widely accessible not just EVS, but also e-bikes, scooters. Engage and educate diverse communities on routes, rules, resources
- <u>Live local</u> "10 minute neighborhoods". Zoning that allows for mixed use, walkable/bikeable streets
