

RACE & THE CUBAN REVOLUTION

A LECTURE BY ALEJANDRO DE LA FUENTE

Alejandro de la Fuente is the Robert Woods Bliss Professor of Latin American History and Economics, Professor of African and African American Studies and of History at Harvard University. His areas of expertise include comparative slavery, race relations, and Atlantic history. Among his many accomplishments, de la Fuente is also the founding director of the Institute of Afro-Latin American Studies at Harvard and co-chair of the university's Cuban Studies Program.

His book A Nation for All: Race, Inequality, and Politics in Twentieth-Century Cuba received the Southern Historical Association's 2003 prize for "best book in Latin American History." He is also the author of Havana and the Atlantic in the Sixteenth Century and editor of two bilingual (Spanish-English) volumes, Grupo Antillano: The Art of AfroCuba and Queloides: Race and Racism in Cuban Contemporary Art.
