Tel Aviv has informed us that students who take courses offered during spring session 1 will be permitted to schedule early exams, in order to receive grades in time for graduation/bar certification. That being stated, a VERY limited amount of courses will be offered during spring session 1 (no more than 6-10 courses); therefore, students seeking a large catalog of courses to choose from should participate during their 2L year.
Leiden's spring semester runs considerably later than BU Law's spring semester. In the past, participating 3L's have arranged to take their exams in April, in order for final transcripts to be received by BU Law in time for commencement and bar certification. We cannot make any guarantees that transcripts will be sent in a timely manner, even if previous arrangments are made. Therefore, 3L's are encouraged to participate in the fall semester.
As the fall semester in Singapore starts far in advance of BU Law's fall term, students with summer internship opportunities should plan to participate during the spring semester. While Singapore will send a certified letter confirming that 3L participants passed all of their courses prior to Commencement, final transcripts will not be available until late July. This certified letter meets the criteria for BU Law's commencement requirements and for the bar certification requirements of some, but not all, state bar exams. Any 3L student interested in participating should review the requirements the state bar exam he or she intends to sit for prior to participating in the spring semester.
It is quite difficult to find housing in Madrid without a Spanish bank account or without some Spanish languge speaking abilities.
BU Law and the ILF run on different academic calendars. Single semester students may only attend the ILF during the equivalent of BU Law's spring term. Spring semester classes for the LL.M Finance degree program run into mid-July. Therefore third-year BU Law students will not be eligible in May or take the summer bar exam. They will be eligible to receive their BU Law JD degree in September and sit for a February bar exam.
Second year students will not return to the US until mid-July, which will implicate possible summer associate or other US-based internship opportunities. On the other hand, ILF will arrange for them to receive summer internship placements at financial institutions in Frankfurt or elsewhere in Europe, it they desire (from mid-July to mid/late August).

Geneva's spring semester runs considerably later than BU Law's spring semester. In the past, participating 3L's have arranged to take their exams in April, in order for final transcripts to be received by BU Law in time for commencement and bar certification. We cannot make any guarantees that transcripts will be sent in a timely manner, even if previous arrangements are made. Therefore, 3L's are encouraged to participate in the fall semester. Additionally, it is important to note that the private housing rental market in Geneva is notoriously difficult to navigate; thus, participants are encouraged to begin their search for housing well in advance of the start of the program.

UBA's "spring" semester runs late, considerably past BU Law's spring semester. For 3Ls, this means that there is no guarantee that you will be able to complete your UBA studies prior to BU Law graduation, or receive final transcripts from UBA in time to meet bar certification requirements (which can be as early as mid-June). 3L students are therefore encouraged to consider the fall program. Likewise, 2Ls who are interested in spring term studies at UBA will need to make special arrangements with their summer employers to begin work in early July. (Students have occasionally arranged to complete a portion of their "summer" clerkships in January/February, prior to going overseas.)

Paris II's "spring" semester runs late, considerably past BU Law's spring semester. For 3Ls, this means that there is no guarantee that you will be able to complete your Paris II studies prior to BU Law graduation, or receive final transcripts from Paris II in time to meet bar certification requirements for the summer 2014 bar (which can be as early as mid-June). Therefore, 3L students are therefore encouraged to participate during the fall semester. Likewise, 2Ls who are interested in spring term studies at Paris II may need to make special arrangements with their summer employers to begin work in early July.

Florence's "spring" semester runs late, considerably past BU Law's spring semester. For 3Ls, this means that there is no guarantee that you will be able to complete your Florence studies prior to BU Law graduation, or receive final transcripts from Florence in time to meet bar certification requirements for the summer 2014 bar (which can be as early as mid-June). Therefore, 3L students are therefore encouraged to participate during the fall semester. Likewise, 2Ls who are interested in spring term studies may need to make special arrangements with their summer employers to begin work in early July.

While all courses are taught in English, all participants are encouraged to have a strong grasp of the French language. The Paris housing market is notoriously difficult to navigate; therefore, participants are encouraged to arrive in Paris at 4-5 weeks prior to orientation in order to secure housing.

Fall semester orientation is held in early August; therefore, participants will likely need to make arrangements with employers to leave summer internships early. Additionally, Singapore's spring semester runs somewhat later than BU Law's spring semester. While Singapore will send a certified letter confirming that 3L participants passed all of their courses prior to Commencement, final transcripts will not be available until late July. This certified letter meets the criteria for BU Law's commencement requirements and for the bar certification requirements of some, but not all, state bar exams.

Fall semester orientation is held in early August; therefore, participants will likely need to make arrangements with employers to leave summer internships early. Internships in Madrid are guaranteed for all participants.
