D'Addio has served for seven years as an Assistant United States Attorney in Boston, where he has investigated and prosecuted high-profile white collar and violent crimes, including international drug trafficking and money laundering, human trafficking, financial fraud, cybercrime, and intellectual property crime. In 2013, he received a commendation from then FBI Director Robert Mueller for his work dismantling a violent cocaine and heroin-trafficking organization operating on Cape Cod.
