My natural gravitation, whether in formal positions, positions of public trust, or in a volunteer capacity, remains program design, management and oversight, with immense strengths in the areas of programmatic evaluation and strategic planning. Some of the most germane examples of my work are:

- Founded the Congressional Universal Healthcare Task Force on Capitol Hill, part of the foundation that galvanized universal access to healthcare as a campaign priority and signature program of the Obama administration that led to Obama Care;
- Performed groundbreaking work as a gubernatorial appointee to a statewide commission on government reform and
 restructuring that streamlined government services while making them more user-friendly, minimized taxes and led to the
 creation of a new task force that essentially saved local governments \$30 million through the elimination and reduction in
 unnecessary unfunded government mandates annually;
- Created a multi-faceted model outreach program for a statewide academic-public-private partnership that: a) netted a result of exposing more than 500 students to more than 40 scientists through the establishment of partnering agreements with secondary schools statewide; b) created an affirmative action plan to address University of Delaware recruitment of underrepresented minorities to graduate programs in the life sciences and engineering: and c) created a web-based, live stream module and curriculum for use to link 1,000+ students;
- Led a citywide (population size of 157,000) strategic plan, with more than 5,000 stakeholders (public officials, city employees, business representatives, and citizens) to improve education and quality of life for families that led to the merge of two city committees for the established of the Joint Collaborative Commission on Children and Families, work and programming that led to the nationwide recognition of this city as one of the best cities in the U.S. for families;
- Created the framework for an education network providing unique global learning opportunities to inner-city children by
 utilizing a proprietary curriculum I designed, with a cross-disciplinary focus in language immersion (Arabic, Mandarin
 Chinese, German, Japanese) and S.T.E.A.M (science, technology, engineering, art from an architectural design perspective
 and math), bringing together a university collaborative partner to provide in-kind education services through coursework for
 college credit and global college entry beginning in 9th grade, other national partners and city-departments and securing
 grant funding for program sustainability and enhancement; and
- Developed a minority mentoring program at Miami Law that served as the precursor/catalyst, model for a statewide
 mentoring program affecting more than 3,000 law students across the State of Florida. The program has received the
 American Bar Association's Diversity Award for improving diversity in the legal profession, particularly in large and midsized
 firms.
