BOSTON UNIVERSITY'S METROPOLITAN COLLEGE ANNOUNCES NEW SCHOLARSHIP:
Osher Re-entry Scholarship Fund Provides Financial Aid for Higher Ed Undergraduate Students

Boston, MA—June 25, 2008: Boston University's Metropolitan College has just been announced as a recipient of the coveted <u>Osher Reentry Scholarship Fund</u>. Provided by the <u>Bernard Osher Foundation</u>, the scholarship provides financial assistance for undergraduate students who wish to return to higher education after a significant hiatus in their studies. The grant amounts to \$50,000 for the first year; up to 20 eligible students will compete for awards of \$2,500.

The Osher Reentry Scholarship is good news for those who have not been able to complete their bachelor's degree. Returning to school can be a Catch-22: for people in the workforce, finding time for classes can jeopardize years of hard work; on the other hand, not having a bachelor's degree can make career advancement a real challenge.

Metropolitan College is ideally positioned to serve aspiring students who are working full-time and hoping to achieve closure on this chapter of their education. Available to people with a cumulative gap of five years or more in their undergraduate studies, the Osher Reentry Scholarship does a lot to ease the financial burden of going back to school. Combined with Metropolitan College's accessibility—classes are conveniently held in the evenings—the scholarship brings a prestigious Boston University degree within reach.

Along with a variety of part-time undergraduate degrees, the Metropolitan College Executive Degree Completion Program (EDCP) is also open to Osher Reentry Scholars. Tailor-made for motivated professionals, the EDCP not only provides an accelerated course of study towards a bachelor's degree, but follows a cohort format so that students benefit from working alongside others with the same motivation. For students with a minimum of 65 transferable undergraduate credits, the EDCP provides a foundation in the liberal arts and sciences, combined with state-of-the-art management theory and

practice in a range of management topics, such as finance, electronic commerce, market analysis, and project and operations management. Studying evenings and Saturdays, EDCP students can earn a <u>Boston University Bachelor of Science in Management Studies</u> in as little as 20 months.

To be eligible for the Osher Reentry Scholarship, applicants must be between the ages of 25 and 50; be planning to return to or continue in the workforce; and demonstrate financial need.
