The Massachusetts Department of Correction Academic Scholarship

Boston University's Metropolitan College offers a graduate scholarship program specifically designed to benefit employees of the Massachusetts Department of Correction (DOC).

The Department of Correction Academic Scholarship will be awarded to ten current DOC employees who demonstrate potential for academic excellence. The DOC Academic Scholarship covers 100 percent of tuition, exclusive of fees, for up to 11.5 graduate-level credits per semester at BU's Metropolitan College.

Recipients of the scholarship will be required to maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 to continue receiving the tuition benefits of the program. Applicants to online programs are not eligible for these awards.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to be considered for the DOC Academic Scholarship, applicants must:

- Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Submit the Metropolitan College Application for Graduate Admission and be accepted into a degree program
- Be a US citizen or permanent resident

Scholarship Application Guidelines

The DOC Academic Scholarship application form must be submitted with the following documents:

- Metropolitan College Application for Graduate Admission
- An essay describing motivation for study (approximately 500 words)
- Current résumé
- Official transcript, or notarized full-sized copy of transcript, from college or university where bachelor's degree was earned; must be sent in a sealed and stamped envelope to the address below
- Three letters of recommendation (one of which should be an academic reference)

Application Deadline:

- Fall semester—August 15
- Spring semester—December 1
