- Remaining 4 courses made up of:
 - 4 Electives **or** a specific concentration:
 - Crime Analysis
 - Cybercrime Investigation & Cybersecurity
 - Strategic Management

- 4 core courses + 4 concentration courses
 - Required:
 - AD 612 COO-Public Emergency Management
 - CJ 711 Criminal Justice Policy and Planning
 - +2 electives


Masters Degree vs. Graduate Certificate

- A graduate certificate program is made up of 16 credits (4 courses) in a specific subject area. The completion of the coursework typically indicates the mastering of this specific subject area. Certificates are generally meant for students who are looking to improve their knowledge within a chosen area.
- A Master's Degree program leads to an academic degree.
 Students are required to take a set of courses core courses that offer a solid advanced understanding of the discipline and then can choose to focus their study in one specific area by declaring a concentration.
- Students may take a graduate certificate in conjunction with a related master's degree program.

Masters Degree vs. Graduate Certificate

- Graduate Certificates are non-degree academic programs that consist of 4 courses (16 credits) in a specific area of study.
- BU MET offers 4 Graduate Certificates in:
 - Criminal Justice
 - Crime Analysis
 - Cybercrime Investigation & Cybersecurity
 - Strategic Management in Criminal Justice
- Students may take a graduate certificate in conjunction with a related master's degree program or start in a Graduate Certificate before "rolling up" into the related Master's program.

Graduate Admission Process



- Rolling admission
- Admissions decisions sent within 1-3 weeks
- Recommend applying at least 1 month before start term (2-3 months for international students)

Application fee (\$85 Master's Degree, \$25 Graduate Certificate)

Transcripts

Transcripts from all colleges and universities attended*

*Transcripts must be in English. Unofficial & in-progress transcripts are acceptable for the admissions review process. Official transcripts are required upon enrollment.

Professional Portfolio

- Current Resume
- Personal Statement
- Three letters of recommendation**

**It is required that one letter of recommendation be an <u>academic</u> reference if you graduated or engaged in post-graduate education in the past three years.

Test Scores

- NO GRE/GMAT required (optional to submit)
- TOEFL/IELTS/Duolingo requirement for international students

PART-TIME: 1-2 courses (<12 credits)	\$925 per CREDIT (4 credit course: \$3,700)




Financial Options:

Taking a course (or two):

- Students can register for up to 2 courses prior to formal admission
